Forbes Highlights Anchorage Transportation and Logistics. The advantages of Anchorage's strategic location as a business hub are highlighted in a recent story published on Forbes.com. The article on the site last week notes that Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport is first in the U.S. for cargo delivery and second in the world. It also handles 90 percent of all air cargo from Asia and is a major hub for both FedEx and UPS. "Part of Anchorage's advantage comes from its being two to five hours faster in package handling and turnaround than U.S. West Coast cities like Los Angeles and Seattle," the article states.

Public Invited to Delaney Park Planning Meeting. A public open house designed to get the community's ideas and discuss improvements for the Delaney Park Strip will be held from 6:30-9 p.m. Tuesday at Denali Elementary School. The ideas discussed will come from the draft Delaney Park Master Plan, which incorporates the work of the Delaney Park Community Advisory Group as well as comments gathered from a two-day public workshop in 2005. As other plans within Downtown Anchorage progress, it is important to ensure that all of the projects work together to make the heart of the city vibrant and diverse.
