This Ordinance, upon becoming effective, shall grant Service Area 36 the power to provide land use control services designed to regulate surface activity at and near private airports located in Service Area 36, and to provide for enforcement of regulations as adopted.

PROPOSITION 12: Shall the following ordinance be adopted and effective within Service Area 36?

(A) The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide for the regulation and control of certain surface activities at private airports within Service Area No. 36 in order to protect the health, safety, welfare and property of persons living in Service Area No. 36.

(B) No private airport within Service Area No. 36, which is located within fifty yards of two or more residential dwellings, may have in excess of twenty-five (25) aircraft based at or operating out of such airport, unless a majority of the voters within the Service Area have, at a general or special election, approved such increased usage.

(C) No taxiway unless parallel and contiguous to a private airport in Service Area No. 36 shall exceed one hundred feet in length.

(D) The voters of Service Area No. 36 may, at some later date, by majority vote, at a general or special election, vote to contract with the Municipality of Anchorage for the purpose of providing services to enforce and administer airport land use safety regulations applicable to such Service Area.

(E) If any part of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable, it shall not be construed as affecting the validity or enforceability of any other part of this Ordinance.

(F) "Private Airport", as used in this Ordinance, shall mean the ground area actually in regular use for the landing and takeoff of fixed-wing aircraft, and shall also include any related taxiways and aprons.

(G) Any airport in Service Area No. 36 which is found to be in violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a public nuisance and shall be subject to abatement and injunction as provided by law.

(H) This Ordinance is intended to regulate land use only and shall not be construed as being in conflict with federal or state law.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF A PROPOSITION
RELATIVE TO THE EXTENSION OF POLICE PROTECTION SERVICES.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. A proposition in substantially the same form as appears in Section 2, below shall be placed on the ballot at the regular election currently scheduled for October 4, 1977. The vote on the proposition shall be conducted throughout the Municipality and vote totals shall be computed both on an area-wide basis and for each individual area of the Municipality which does not now receive municipal police protection services, which areas are more fully described on the map attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein. An affirmative vote by a majority of those voting area-wide shall be required for approval of the extension of police protection services outside those areas now served. In addition, an affirmative vote by a majority of those voting in each area on the proposal shall be required for approval of the extension of police protection service into that area.

Section 2. The proposition shall be presented in substantially the following form:
