PROPOSITION 1 CHARTER AMENDMENT-TRUST FUND	
Shall the Anchorage Charter be amended to add a new Section 13.11 to read as follows:	
Section 13.11 TRUST FUND	
(a) When a Municipal owned utility is sold pursuant to Section 16.02 of this Charter, the proceeds shall be used to (1) retire the debt of that utility; (2) retire other Municipal debt deemed appropriate by the Assembly; (3) establish a Trust Fund with the balance of the proceeds.	
(b) The Trust Fund shall be managed by the Municipal Treasurer under Chapter 6.70 of the Municipal Code with the following stipulations: (1) the corpus, or a portion of the corpus, of this trust may only be used for purposes approved by a majority of the voters voting on a ballot proposition in a regular or special election; (2) the earnings of the Trust Fund will be available for appropriations by the Assembly only after the fund has been adjusted for average annual inflation.	
(c) The fund shall be invested and managed in accordance with Chapter 6.50 of the Municipal Code. (AO 89-27(S))

PROPOSITION 2 ATU SALE	
Shall the Municipality of Anchorage sell by ordinance the Anchorage Telephone Utility for a price not less than \$400 million? Proceeds from the sale shall be used to retire the outstanding debt of the Anchorage Telephone Utility and to provide \$100 million to retire or to pay debt service on other Municipal bonded debt. The remaining proceeds shall be placed into a utility trust fund managed by the Municipal Treasurer. The corpus of this fund may be used only after approval of the voters at a special or regular election.
