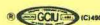

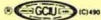

Proposition 12

REDIRECTION OF BOND PROCEEDS AND SCHOOL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS

In 1985, 1991, 1993 and 1994, Anchorage voters approved general obligation bonds for school capital projects. Many of these projects have been completed or are nearing completion for substantially less than their original estimated cost, leaving up to \$24,000,000 of bond proceeds unexpended. With voter approval, these unexpended funds are available for redirection to other school capital projects. To the extent the amount available for redirection is less than \$24,000,000, the following proposition also authorizes the issuance of up to an additional \$3,000,000 in general obligation bonds to provide total funding for new school capital projects of \$24,000,000.

Shall Anchorage (i) redirect the sum of not to exceed Twenty Four Million Dollars (\$24,000,000) of proceeds of the bonds authorized by Ordinance Nos. AO 85-113(S), AO 91-124(S), AO 93-119(S-1) and AO 94-41(S-4, As Amended); and (ii) to the extent the amount available for redirection is less than Twenty-Four Million Dollars (\$24,000,000), incur additional debt and issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000); so that a total of not to exceed Twenty-Four Million Dollars (\$24,000,000) is authorized for the purpose of paying the costs of planning, designing, acquiring property for, site preparation, constructing, acquiring, renovating, installing and equipping school and related capital improvements within the Municipality including but not limited to the following:

Proposition 13

ABOLISHING THE ANCHORAGE POLICE SERVICE AREA (CONTINGENT)

Shall the existing Anchorage Police Service Area be abolished contingent on and simultaneous with the creation of a new police service area which would include all areas of the Municipality north of McHugh Creek?

Abolishing the existing Anchorage Police Service Area would become effective only if approved by a majority of the qualified voters in the Anchorage Police Service Area voting on the question and the simultaneous creation of a new police service area consisting of all areas of the Municipality north of McHugh Creek approved by a majority of the qualified voters in the new police service area voting on the question.

If the proposition to dissolve the Anchorage Police Service Area and the proposition to approve the creation of a new police service area are both approved, police protection services would continue to be provided in the existing Anchorage Police Service Area and would also be extended to all areas of the Municipality north of McHugh Creek presently outside the Anchorage Police Service Area (the "Hillside") effective January 1, 1997. The new police service area would succeed to all of the assets and liabilities, including bonded indebtedness, of the Anchorage Police Service Area.

Creation of the new police service area would enable the Municipality to levy and collect additional property taxes to finance police protection services in that part of the new police service area not presently taxed for such purpose (the "Hillside"). Capital improvements for drainage and street lights and capital improvements and maintenance for sidewalks, overhead walkways, landscaping and similar capital improvements are commonly associated with road improvements and maintenance. This proposition would clarify which services are authorized in CBERRRSA subject to the exceptions noted. Other improvements and **maintenance and operation** services in the road right-of-way not excluded **and not provided by another service area** would be authorized for CBERRRSA. The services excepted from the proposed authorized services are either utilities, services provided by other service areas as in the case of **general street light operation and maintenance**, parks and recreational services or areawide municipal services as in the case of off-road mass transit facilities and signs, parking meters and traffic engineering.
