SALE OF ATU

SUMMARY

Upon approval of the ballot proposition, a competitive invitation to bid process to sell ATU shall be pursued by the Municipality for a period of two (2) years from the certification of the election. ATU will be sold to the highest responsive bid from a responsible bidder for an amount equal to or exceeding fair market value.

BALLOT PROPOSITION

Shall the Municipality of Anchorage sell the Anchorage Telephone Utility for an amount equal to or exceeding fair market value?

The Assembly has approved an ordinance directing that the ATU sale proceeds be used to retire ATU's outstanding debt and to establish a Trust Fund, the income from which, after inflation-proofing, shall be used to (1) replace the annual dividend currently received from ATU, (2) reduce property taxes, and (3) reinvest in the Trust Fund. Any change of the use of proceeds from the ATU sale may be accomplished only with approval of a majority of the qualified voters voting on the question. (AO 98-44(S-2))

The annual increase in taxes on \$100,000 of assessed real and personal property value (based on the estimated 1998 assessed valuation) necessary to retire the proposed debt is \$6.17.

The debt will be paid from individual and business property taxes levied and collected areawide in Anchorage. Anchorage will also pledge its full faith and credit for payment of the debt.

The Municipality expects that future voter approval of general obligation bonds will be necessary to finance the construction costs of each high school. Based on 1998 estimates, construction costs for each high school range between \$40,000,000 - \$70,000,000.
