SUMMARY

Upon approval of the ballot proposition, a competitive invitation to bid process to sell ATU shall be pursued by the Municipality for a period of two (2) years from the certification of the election. BALLOT PROPOSITION

Shall the Municipality of Anchorage sell the Anchorage Telephone Utility for an amount equal to or exceeding fair market value?
