<u>Section 1.</u> Pursuant to state law and the Anchorage Municipal Charter, a ballot proposition in substantially the following form shall be placed on the ballot and submitted to the qualified voters of the Municipality at the next regular municipal election on April 1, 2025:

CHARTER AMENDMENT
TO REQUIRE THE MUNICIPALITY
IMPLEMENT A SINGLE APPLICATION PROCESS FOR
ALL BENEFITS AND ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS IT ADMINISTERS.

This proposition would amend the Anchorage Municipal Charter, Article II and Charter §17.06 as follows (<u>underlined and bolded words</u> are proposed new words; **strikeouts in bold** are proposed deletions):

ARTICLE II BILL OF RIGHTS

This Charter guarantees rights to the people of Anchorage that are in addition to rights guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States of America and the Constitution of the State of Alaska. Among rights guaranteed by this Charter are:

(14) The right to a simplified process to access municipal benefits and assistance programs through a single application.

TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE A BALLOT PROPOSITION AMENDING THE HOME RULE CHARTER TO REQUIRE A SINGLE APPLICATION FOR ALL

MUNICIPAL BENEFITS AND ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS.

This ordinance is bourne out of the sponsors' recognition that, despite our government's obligation to be accessible and responsive to the public, often its myriad of assistance programs and systems can present a barrier to those most in need of assistance.

The proposed ordinance would submit to the qualified voters of Anchorage a ballot proposition that would amend to the Municipal Charter to require the municipal government to create a system whereby an applicant would fill out only a single form to apply for all benefits and services, including but not limited to:

- All state and federal pass-through programs administered by the MOA for the benefit of MOA residents, such as child care assistance, public health services;
- 2. All discounts or rebates available for MOA residents based on certain criteria such as age, income or disability; and
- 3. All exemptions from fees available for MOA residents based on certain criteria as adopted by ordinance or charter.

Any time a resident of the municipality applied for any one program, their application would be used to determine their eligibility for any and all benefits offered by or through the municipality.

We request your support for the ordinance.
