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ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AR No. 2017–375

A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO INITIATE A PETITION PROCESS IN THE NORTH EAGLE RIVER AND SOUTH BIRCHWOOD AREA, IN CONFORMANCE WITH ANCHORAGE MUNICIPIAL CODE SECTIONS 19.20.025 AND 19.20.030 AND TO MAKE A REPORT CONCERNING THE PROPOSED SANITARY SEWER TRUNK IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT FOR CONSIDERATION EITHER BEFORE OR AT THE TIME OF PUBLIC HEARING ON THE NECESSITY FOR THE PROPOSED SERVICE.

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility (AWWU) recently requested and received from the Regulatory Commission of Alaska (RCA) approved modifications to its Wastewater Tariff Rule 8 refining the process to implement special assessments through a Trunk Improvement District (TID) for wastewater (sewer) trunk improvements;

WHEREAS, sewer trunk lines are larger mains and generally only lateral mains connect to them and provide wastewater service to individual parcels, thus the area of a TID is a function of geography of the drainage basin in the area served; delineation is based on possible alignments of lateral mains, AWWU approved master plans, and the will of the property owners within the delineated area;

WHEREAS, Wastewater Tariff Rule 8 provides methods for property owners and AWWU to coordinate the construction and payment of sewer trunk and lateral infrastructure project costs;

WHEREAS, TID project costs are recovered from the benefitted properties by either

- (i) creating sewer lateral main improvement districts (LIDs) for smaller areas for construction of lateral sewer lines connected to the trunk line and levy the TID assessment on the benefitted parcels upon completion of the lateral facilities necessary to provide sanitary sewer service to those parcels at the same time the LID assessment is levied on them;
- (ii) a private developer entering into an agreement with AWWU whereby the developer agrees to pay for installation of sewer lateral infrastructure necessary to serve the proposed development and to pay the TID assessments for the benefitted properties within the development in accordance with the agreement, with parcels outside the proposed private development and benefitted by the private developer

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	 construction of sewer infrastructure being levied for project costs only upon connection to that infrastructure; or (iii) AWWU constructing lateral mains, identifying a benefitted area without establishing a new assessment district, and making assessments due on a levy upon connection (LUC) basis; only parcels not previously levied for the TID assessment under (i) or (ii) can qualify, and upon connection to sewer service the assessment for both the TID and the AWWU-constructed lateral main are levied on the parcel.
9 10 11 12 13 14 15	WHEREAS, after the TID is approved and constructed, all properties within the proposed TID are considered benefitted for purposes of the TID, but the resulting TID assessments are levied only upon either (i) completion of constructed improvements in the case of an LID, or (ii) connection to developer- constructed infrastructure;
16 17 18 19 20	WHEREAS , AWWU is the utility certificated by the Regulatory Commission of Alaska to serve North Eagle River and South Birchwood but AWWU does not have the existing sewer infrastructure to accommodate proposed development in the North Eagle River and South Birchwood areas;
21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, in conformance with Anchorage Municipal Code, Wastewater Tariff Rule 8, and this Assembly Resolution, potentially benefitted parties of a North Eagle River/South Birchwood TID shall be balloted in coordination with the Municipal Clerk and findings reported by the Mayor to the Assembly; and
25 26 27 28 29	WHEREAS, the potential benefitted properties in development of the North Eagle River/South Birchwood TID are identified within the potential boundaries of the TID and will include: Powder Hills Tracts at Powder Ridge Reserves, Tracts A, C, D, M, P, R, U-1, U-2, & 40-A3; Powder Ridge Tracts, Tract B; now therefore,
30 31	THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:

Pursuant to AMC section 19.20.025, the Mayor is authorized and directed to initiate the petition process and make a report to the Assembly in conformance with AMC section 19.20.030 on a proposed special assessment district to be created for sewer trunk improvements benefitting the North Eagle River and South Birchwood area.
39 40 41 42 43	Section 2 . The Mayor's Office is requested to identify the properties within a North Eagle River/South Birchwood TID boundary, proceed with balloting property owners within the boundaries, and make recommendations as to whether or not to proceed with creation of the wastewater (sewer) Trunk Improvement District.

AR initiating a Sewer TID in the North Eagle River and South Birchwood areas

<u>Section 3.</u> The Anchorage Assembly recognizes that AWWU does not have existing sewer infrastructure sufficient to meet proposed development in the North Eagle River and South Birchwood areas and supports utilizing RCA approved Wastewater Tariff Rule 8 to create the proposed sewer Trunk Improvement District.

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Subject: A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO INITIATE A PETITION PROCESS IN THE NORTH EAGLE RIVER AND SOUTH BIRCHWOOD AREA, IN CONFORMANCE WITH AMC SECTIONS 19.20.025 AND 19.20.030 AND TO MAKE A REPORT CONCERNING THE PROPOSED SEWER TRUNK IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT FOR CONSIDERATION EITHER BEFORE OR AT THE TIME OF PUBLIC HEARING ON THE NECESSITY FOR THE PROPOSED SERVICE.

The Anchorage Assembly may authorize and direct the Mayor to initiate processes for wastewater utility (sewer) trunk infrastructure improvements through a proposed sewer Trunk Improvement District (TID). This process is used to expand the areas where wastewater service is available and to create special assessment districts. This resolution proposes to initiate a process for wastewater/sewer infrastructure improvements to benefit North Eagle River and South Birchwood. As presently constructed, Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility (AWWU) systems are unable to meet sewer service requests for proposed housing and commercial developments in this area.

23 AWWU recently requested and received approval from the Regulatory Commission of Alaska (RCA) for modifications to its Wastewater Tariff Rule 8. 24 This tariff rule refined the process of implementing a special assessment for sewer 25 26 trunk improvements through use of a Trunk Improvement District (TID). This modification provides methods for property owners and AWWU to coordinate the 27 construction and payment for sewer trunk infrastructure. TID project costs are 28 29 recovered from benefitted properties by either (i) creating a TID whose costs are levied on the benefitted parcels upon completion of the lateral collection facilities 30 31 necessary to provide service to those parcels through creation of a separate 32 Lateral Improvement District (LID), or (ii) entering into a private development agreement with AWWU whereby the developer agrees to pay for installation of 33 sewer trunk and lateral infrastructure necessary to serve the proposed 34 development. AWWU generally will not allow direct connection by an individual 35 36 parcel to a sewer trunk main.

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The area of this proposed TID is defined by such factors as possible lateral main alignments, demand for wastewater service, the geography of the area, and anticipated development schedule. For purposes of the initial service area boundary development, all properties within the proposed borders are considered benefitted. This designation does not require connection or levy of assessment.

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Upon approval of this Assembly Resolution, the following steps outline the process
 that will take place as further detailed in Title 19 of the Anchorage Municipal Code
 and AWWU Tariff Rule 8:

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5	AWWU will:
6	 Identify the parcels to be benefitted by the project;
7	 Estimate the total assessable project cost; Determine if the project fite within AMMAILING Conital Improvement
8	• Determine if the project fits within AWWU's Capital Improvement
9	Plan and is economically feasible for AWWU;
10	 Establish a time schedule for the project;
11	o Notify affected property owners about the project, including the
12	estimated assessment for each parcel and other information; and
13	 Engage potentially benefitted property owners in balloting to approve
14	the proposed TID.
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16	• Owners of benefitted parcels vote on whether to approve the proposed TID.
17	 The Mayor reports to the Assembly on the outcome of the vote.
18	 If the TID does not receive the approval of parcel owners that will
19	bear more than 50% of the estimated total assessable project cost of
20	the project, the TID fails and the process ends.
21	 If the TID does receive the approval of parcel owners that will bear
22	more than 50% of the estimated total assessable project cost,
23	AWWU shall notify the Assembly to proceed with a public hearing.
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25	• The Assembly will then:
26	 Hold a public hearing on the necessity of the TID; and
27	o Consider an ordinance to determine whether to establish the
28	improvement district, proceed with the proposed improvements, and
29	assess properties for their allocated share of the costs.
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31	Parcel owners included in the TID have up to 60 days following notice of
32	public hearing to file objections:
33	 If objections are received in writing from parcel owners that will bear
34	more than 50% of the estimated total assessable project cost, the
35	project does not proceed until the objections are reduced under 50%.
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37	• If the ordinance is approved by the Assembly, AWWU will solicit bids for
38	construction of the improvements.
39	 If lowest bid to build the project comes in more than 10% above
40	AWWU's estimate, the project does not move forward unless parcel
41	owners that will bear more than 50% of the total assessable project
42	cost request the contract be awarded.
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44	• After the improvements are completed, assessments will be calculated for
45	each benefitted parcel, based on allocation of actual assessable costs
46	incurred by AWWU.
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11 12 13 • The resulting TID assessments are levied only upon either (i) completion of constructed improvements in the case of a sewer lateral improvement district connecting to the sewer trunk main, or (ii) connection to developer-constructed or utility-constructed infrastructure.

Assessments constitute a lien against the property only if actually levied as outlined above. No monies are due for the benefitted property's share of the improvements until the property assessment is levied. Upon levying of the assessment, property owners have the option to pay the assessment in annual installments payable over a period of time that can be up to thirty years, depending on the actual value of the assessment.
