Statistics on Hunger in Alaska

- 1 in 8 Alaskans and 1 in 6 Alaskan children are food insecure
- 92,100 Alaskans received SNAP in 2022, more than 66% are in families with children and over 37% are in working families
- In Anchorage, there are roughly 32,410 food insecure people, including around 10,000 children according to Feeding America's Map the Meal Gap data


How Do We Do This?



Pounds of Food Distributed by Food Bank of Alaska

- 35% decrease in distributions year over year, state assistance has reduced this shortfall in the last year
- Decrease in food from donations and government programs
- We have not seen a corresponding decrease in need. In fact, with rising costs, our agency partners are expressing a dramatic increase in need.

TEFAP – The Emergency Food Assistance Program

Statewide, for anyone with incomes below 185% of poverty level



CSFP – Commodity Supplemental Food Program

For low-income seniors with incomes below 185% of poverty level

SFSP – Summer Food Service Program

Reimbursement for snacks/meals for children during summer programs
