
Trail selection:





• Consistent Coach Safety Training

Efforts

- 100% compliance for all coaches to complete SafeSport
- SafeSport standard in ASD & other school-age programs
- SafeSport gives coaches tools on what to look for, how to address and helps support judgement calls
- Waivers for Coaches/Riders/Parents
- Two-day coach training by BICP/PMBIA certified coaches

New Age Cut-Off

Challenge

- Volunteer Coach qualification for higher level skills
- Mission statement alignment (teach fundamentals and life-long love of biking!)
- Female rider attrition
- Riders developing independent styles (Ex. XC/racing/technical)

Efforts

- Concentrate on fundamentals/mission
- Feeder for Hilltop youth programs
- Investing in/involving future volunteers (Jr. Coaches)
- Groups with higher participation move up to advanced
- More consistent interests, encourage riders to utilize existing programs to challenge themselves (Arctic MTB races, Hilltop programs, private coaching)
