Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise

With a mission to help small businesses owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals, the DOT adopted a policy to allow these owners to participate in contracting opportunities created by DOT financial assistance programs.

-In 1983, Congress enacted the first Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) statutory provision. This provision required the Department to ensure that at least 10% of the funds authorized for the highway and transit Federal financial assistance programs be expended with DBEs

What is a DBE?

- Minority-owned (MBE), Women-owned (WBE), Economically Disadvantaged (DBE) -your business must be 51% owned by socially and economically disadvantaged individual(s)
- Certification is based on: on site visits, personal interviews, Reviews of Licenses, stock ownership, equipment, bonding capacity, work completed, resume of principal owners & financial capacity
- Personal net worth cannot exceed \$1.32 million, excluding the value of the business and their primary residence
- ► Certification is done through the State DOT Civil Rights Office

Code of Federal Regulations 49 CFR 26

Section 26.21-Who must have a DBE Program?

- (A): If you are in one of these categories, you must have a DBE program meeting the requirements of this part:
 - (1) All FHWA recipients receiving funds authorized by a statute to which this part applies;
 - (2) FTA recipients receiving planning, capital and/or operating assistance who will award prime contracts (excluding transit vehicle purchases) exceeding \$250,000 in FTA funds in a Federal fiscal year;
 - (3) FAA recipients receiving grants for airport planning or development who will award prime contracts exceeding \$250,000 in FAA funds in a Federal fiscal year
- -Implementation of the program is accorded the same priority as compliance with all other legal obligations incurred by the MOA in its financial assistance agreements with the federal DOT
- -This program applies to all contracts funded wholly or in part with financial assistance from the Federal DOT and its operating elements (FTA, FAA, FHWA)
 - -Additionally, this program complies with the requirements of Anchorage Municipal Code 7.60.
- -As the MOA is a recipient of direct federal dollars, it is OEO's job to ensure that the MOA is complying with all provisions of the Code of Federal Regulations 49 Part 26
- -The MOA DBE program operates under three Department of Transportation administrations (FTA, FAA, FHWA)

Objectives of the DBE Program

- -To ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts in the Department's highway, transit, and airport financial assistance programs
- -To create a level playing field on which DBEs can compete fairly for DOT-assisted contracts
- -To ensure that the Department's DBE program is narrowly tailored in accordance with applicable law
- -To ensure that only firms that fully meet this part's eligibility standards are permitted to participate as DBEs
- -To help remove barriers to the participation of DBEs in DOT-assisted contracts
- -To assist the development of firms that can compete successfully in the marketplace outside the DBE program
- -To provide appropriate flexibility to recipients of Federal financial assistance in establishing and providing opportunities for DBEs

MOA DBE Program Requirements

- ► The Municipality of Anchorage Office of Equal Opportunity is currently administering a **race neutral** DBE program
- Race Neutral v Race Conscious
- Western States Paving Co. v. Washington State Department of Transportation: The court emphasized that public agencies must base their DBE programs on concrete evidence of discrimination
- The 9th Circuit Court of Appeals has established several legal precedents regarding race-conscious and race-neutral policies in the context of DBE programs (Alaska)
- ► Race neutral=Goals should be aspirational rather than mandatory
- Race-neutral programs focus on broad support, while race-conscious programs specifically address racial and ethnic disparities
 - The establishment of contract goals for DBE participation is a race conscious measure. Race neutral, on the other hand, is a measure or program that is used to assist all small businesses. A race neutral approach, which allows all small business to compete, including DBEs, is one way to meet your "participation goal"

-the Municipality sets "participation goals" we hope to meet annually





- Fostering Small Business Participation
- under DOT aims to support small and disadvantaged businesses in the transportation sector
- ► SBA size standards apply
 - ► -no limits/geographics preferences
 - -no participation goals
 - ▶ average five years of annual receipts and ensure that is within the SB size standard for the applicable NAICS code. to be considered small to enter the 8a program it goes by adjusted gross income (\$400K or less), personal net worth of \$850K or less, and assets totaling \$6.5M or less
