1 AN OMNIBUS ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY AMENDING  
2 ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE AND ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE OF  
3 REGULATIONS TO MODIFY EXISTING, AND INCLUDE ADDITIONAL, FEES,  
4 FINES, AND PENALTIES, AND TO MODIFY EXCISE TAXES ON MOTOR  
5 VEHICLE REGISTRATION AND AIRCRAFT.

8 THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

10 **Section 1:** Anchorage Municipal Code section 8.40.030 is amended to read as  
11 follows:

13       **8.40.030      Alarm registration.**

15       A person who owns or possesses an alarm shall register immediately  
16 certain information required by the chief of police [WITH THE CHIEF OF  
17 POLICE], including, without limitation, the identity of the owner, the location  
18 of the alarm, and the name and telephone number of a responsible  
19 individual for that alarm. An owner is under a continuing obligation to keep  
20 the information on his registration current by reporting any change to the  
21 chief of police within ten days. The police department shall charge a fee  
22 of \$25.00 for the annual registration.

27 **Section 2:** Anchorage Municipal Code section 8.40.040 is amended to read as  
28 follows (*the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out*):

30       **8.40.040      False alarm charges.**

32       A. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, the owner of an alarm  
33 shall pay a charge in accordance with this section for each [AND  
34 EVERY] false alarm to which the police or fire department are  
35 dispatched:

37           1. First [TWO] false alarm[S IN ANY 30-DAY PERIOD OR FIRST THREE  
38           IN ANY 90 DAY PERIOD] at each identifiable separate location:  
39           No charge.

- 1           2. Each subsequent false alarm in excess of one [TWO IN ANY  
2           30-DAY PERIOD OR THREE IN ANY 90-DAY PERIOD]:  
3  
4            a. Fire department: [...] \$500.00  
5            b. Police department: [...]  
6  
7            i. Second and third response: \$125.00 each  
8            [75.00]  
9  
10           ii. Each subsequent false alarm: \$25.00 more  
11           than the prior false alarm charge at the same  
12           identifiable location. A location previously  
13           charged under this section that has no false  
14           alarms in a consecutive 12-month period shall  
15           have the next false alarm charge beginning at  
16           the amount in subsection A.2.b.i. and  
17           increased thereafter in accordance with this  
18           subsection.  
19  
20           3. A single identifiable location that has 12 false alarms in any  
21           consecutive 12-month period shall have its alarm registration  
22           automatically revoked by the chief of police, and the owner  
23           shall have the alarm disconnected, disabled or rendered  
24           inoperable. After such revocation, the alarm at that location  
25           cannot re-register until the owner presents proof to the chief  
26           of police the mechanical or personnel issues causing the  
27           frequent false alarms have been resolved. Following said  
28           approval, the owner of a revoked permit shall register the  
29           alarm in accordance with section 8.40.030 and pay the  
30           applicable fee as if it were an initial registration.

35           chapter 8.100, which shall read as follows:

36           **Chapter 8.100       Fees for police department services.**

37           8.100.020   Fee for processing federal firearms forms.

38           State law references: Execution of federal firearms forms. AS 18.65.810.

39           **8.100.020   Fee for processing federal firearms forms.**

1           The chief of police or a designee whom is a sworn police officer employed  
2           full-time with the municipality shall, in accordance with state and federal  
3           law, execute federal firearms forms required to be submitted to the federal  
4           government by a person as a transferee of a firearm if the chief of police  
5           has no information indicating the receipt or possession of the firearm by  
6           the person would place the person in violation of state or local law or that  
7           the person will use the firearm for other than lawful purposes. The police  
8           department shall charge a fee of \$150.00 to process such requests, and  
9           may require payment in advance.

10  
11           **Section 4:** Anchorage Municipal Code section 9.06.115 is hereby amended to  
12           read as follows (*the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set*  
13           *out*):

14           **9.06.115       Hourly rate for police services.**

16           A. Police services shall be charged at the rate of \$110.00 per hour,  
17           per police officer, for non-municipal functions, including but not  
18           limited to:  
19  
20           1. Traffic control;  
21  
22           2. Crowd control;  
23  
24           3. Distinguished visitor detail;  
25  
26           4. Activities occurring under municipal permit in municipal right-  
27           of-way; or  
28  
29           5. Any political or non-political events, rallies or gatherings.  
30  
31  
32           B. Requests for police services at any of the types of functions  
33           described above shall provide prior written notice as follows:  
34  
35           1. Written requests received more than ten days in advance of  
36           the function shall be charged a two-hour minimum for each  
37           police officer, even if the function is less than two hours in  
38           length; or  
39  
40           2. Written requests received ten days or less prior to the  
41           function shall be charged a four-hour minimum for each  
42           police officer, even if the function is less than four hours in  
43           length. Such requests may result in charges of \$147.00 per  
44           hour of overtime incurred by police officers assigned to  
45           provide services for the function.

This ordinance makes a number of changes in fees, fines, and taxes. These changes range from increasing the fine for a false alarm to an increase in the aircraft registration tax to implementing new fees associated with compliance with the Federal National Pollution Discharge Elimination System requirements.

Community Budget Dialogue participants were supportive of users of a service paying toward its cost. These changes reflect this approach and also help diversify the Municipality's revenues.

In total, these changes will increase 2011 revenue by \$2.1 million, which already is included in the 2011 proposed budgets for General Government and Solid Waste Services.
