'ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AR NO. 2010–168(S)

A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY SUPPORTING THE PREFERRED CURRENT LOCATION FOR MILITARY ARTILLERY PRACTICE AND MAKING FINDINGS AGAINST THE CREATION OF A NEW LIVE FIRE ARTILLERY RANGE IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO EXISTING NEIGHBORHOODS OF EAST ANCHORAGE.

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Anchorage recognizes the value of the military presence in Alaska and the contribution of military personnel stationed here while serving our country; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Anchorage recognizes the need for military personnel to train year-around and under varying conditions; and

WHEREAS, the United States Army has proposed three possible options for live fire artillery training at Fort Richardson: Option 1 - Continued live fire artillery training on the Eagle River flats during the winter months only—summer training conducted out-of-town (current practice); Option 2 — Year-around live fire artillery training on the Eagle River flats; and Option 3 — A new live fire artillery range to be located just east of the Muldoon and Scenic Park neighborhoods of East Anchorage; and

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Assembly recognizes the added expense of conducting training in Interior Alaska, and the preference to keep soldiers closer to home for training between deployments, allowing them to spend more time in the community with friends and family during their time at home; and

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Assembly finds the construction of a new artillery range on the outskirts of the East Anchorage neighborhoods would have serious negative impacts on the residents of those neighborhoods, including excessive noise and increased danger of wild fire; and

WHEREAS, the construction of a completely new live fire artillery range on the outskirts of East Anchorage would involve considerable time, effort, and expense, and is disruptive to existing community neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, officials from Fort Richardson have stated that Option #2 – Year-around live fire artillery training at the Eagle River Flats range is the preferred military option, and the environmental impact to use of the Eagle River Flats is under a public comment period until June 13, 2010;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves:

- 1. Option #3 A new artillery firing range in East Anchorage is not supported by the Anchorage Assembly. The Anchorage Assembly finds that Option #3 would cause severe detrimental impacts to the community and residents of nearby neighborhoods, and require unnecessary public expense and inconvenience.
- 2. The Anchorage Assembly recommends rejection of Option #3 (creation of a new artillery firing range in East Anchorage) by the United States Army.
