ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AR No. 2010-178

A RESOLUTION THAT THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ENCOURAGES ALL MEMBERS OF ALASKA'S CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO SUPPORT AND VOTE IN FAVOR OF S.J. RES. 26.

WHEREAS, on April 2, 2007, the Supreme Court found that greenhouse gases are air pollutants covered by the Clean Air Act;

WHEREAS, air pollutants have historically been regulated by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) only after Congress has acted to provide appropriate regulatory authorities;

WHEREAS, the EPA should be charged with implementing the policies enacted by Congress, not writing policy that will have a massive effect;

WHEREAS, Alaska is dependent on resource development for its financial well-being;

WHEREAS, Alaskans are largely in favor of opening the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge (ANWR) for responsible oil and gas development and Alaskans are eager to see construction of a natural gas pipeline;

WHEREAS, proposed regulations by the EPA would result in tremendous additional uncertainty for development of ANWR and may significantly deter or halt progress altogether on a natural gas pipeline;

WHEREAS, the EPA intends to regulate greenhouse gas emissions at levels that will increasingly hamper the ability of businesses in Alaska to compete in the global marketplace and will have a chilling effect on capital investment in Alaska;

WHEREAS, the United States Senate is expected to vote Thursday, June 10, 2010 on a bipartisan disapproval resolution, S.J. Res. 26, that would block the EPA from enforcing greenhouse gas regulations under the Clean Air Act;

WHEREAS, S.J. Res. 26 is sponsored by Alaska's senior Senator Lisa Murkowski and has so far earned the support of 40 other senators;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this body encourages all members of Alaska's Congressional Delegation to support and vote in favor of S.J. Res. 26;

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to Senators Murkowski and Begich, and Congressman Don Young.
