ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AR NO. 2010–242

A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY SUPPORTING THE ANCHORAGE FIREFIGHTERS' ANNUAL 3-HOUR FILL-THE-BOOT EXERCISE AS A COMMUNITY EVENT OF DE MINIMIS EXTRA EXPENSE TO THE MUNICIPALITY.

WHEREAS, Fill-the-Boot has been an exercise endorsed by the Municipality and undertaken by the Anchorage Firefighters as a community event since 1981; and

WHEREAS, once a year for three (3) hours, between the hours of 3:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. on the Friday before Labor Day, Anchorage Firefighters have been joined by community volunteers to raise money to fight muscular dystrophy; and

WHEREAS, since 1954, firefighters in cities all across the United States and Canada have made Fill-the-Boot a community fundraising event to support families stricken with this disabling neuromuscular disease; and

WHEREAS, every year more local governments join in to show support for their firefighters by endorsing and participating in a local Fill-the-Boot community event; and

WHEREAS, since 1981, the Municipality of Anchorage has endorsed and supported this event by staging "at-ready" fire trucks in areas within the fire station district, at no extra expense to the Municipality; and

WHEREAS, the fire trucks and associated crew members are from on-duty stations, where the firefighters would be in paid on-duty status and housed at the station, awaiting a potential call-out to respond; and

WHEREAS, once a year, several fire trucks and associated firefighter crew members (not all) have been allowed by the Municipal Fire Chief to serve their onduty status during the three (3) hour window from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., together with their "at-ready" fire truck in case of call-out, outside the fire station, instead of housed inside the fire station; and

WHEREAS, this 3-hour portion of the participating firefighter's shift has been served with no extra expense to the Municipality; and

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WHEREAS, during this annual 3-hour community event, the on-duty fire trucks and associated firefighter crew members are joined within the fire station district by off-duty firefighters, other off-duty public safety personnel, and community supporters in raising money and awareness to fight of this debilitating neuromuscular disease; and

WHEREAS, muscular dystrophy strikes families in Anchorage, just as it does families in communities throughout Alaska and across America; and

WHEREAS, Anchorage community families who have suffered the disease of muscular dystrophy are significantly helped by the work of Anchorage firefighters in this annual 3-hour community event and in the annual summer camp for muscular dystrophy, staffed with the help of Anchorage firefighter volunteers; and

WHEREAS, funds raised by the Anchorage firefighters during Fill-the-Boot are administered by the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA) under an "open door" policy, accessible to all sufferers of the disease; and

WHEREAS, without assistance from MDA Alaska, many sufferers of muscular dystrophy in our community and their families would be without adequate assistance resources, and this would hurt the community as a whole in many direct and indirect ways; and

WHEREAS, the fundraising model used by Anchorage firefighters in Fill-the-Boot leverages the community's support for its firefighters to directly benefit the sufferers of muscular dystrophy, at no increase in government expense; and

WHEREAS, in 2010, AO 2010-39 and AO 2010-44(S-1) established a street solicitation permitting process and clarified the local governing body's intent not to prohibit the Municipality's continued participation in staging fire trucks out of the station in "at-ready" status during the 3-hour Fill-the-Boot exercise; and

WHEREAS, it is not unusual for public and private entities to pay for "team building" exercises to relieve the stress and depression that may otherwise befall first-responders such as firefighters, by the very nature of their work; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly and the Mayor have engaged in separate and joint efforts to review and delineate legislative policy and administrative procedure regarding various community events, in fairness to all concerned;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOVED that after review of the foregoing considerations, the Anchorage Assembly makes the following findings and recommendations:

1. The Anchorage Municipal Assembly finds the Anchorage Firefighters' annual 3-hour Fill-the-Boot exercise is a community event of *de minimis* extra expense to the Municipality.

2. Absent declaration to the contrary under oath before the Assembly by the Anchorage Fire Chief, the Assembly finds no reason to believe that public safety is at jeopardy if several "at-ready" fire trucks are staged within fire station districts, instead of inside the fire station, during the annual 3-hour Fill-the-Boot exercise.

3. Absent declaration to the contrary under oath before the Assembly by the Anchorage Fire Chief, the Assembly acknowledges the stress inherent to service as a first-responder and finds the annual 3-hour Fill-the-Boot exercise is appropriate to team-building, consistent with principles of esprit de corps, and beneficial to the health and safety of Anchorage firefighters, who serve the Municipality as first-responders.

4. Since 1981, the Municipality of Anchorage has supported the Anchorage Firefighters' endorsement of the fight against muscular dystrophy by making this a community event, complete with "at-ready" fire trucks and associated crew members, uniformed "off-duty" firefighters, and community volunteers.

5. The Anchorage Municipal Assembly calls on the community of Anchorage to support its local firefighters by generously "Filling the Boot" during this annual 3-hour event.

4	under past practice, and policies and procedures that acknowledge and reflect a

8	benefit to the community when there is an identifiable community event that also
