Mission 2: Get to Know Your Firefighter


Firefighters wear different clothes when they fight different kinds of fires.



Mission 3: Be Ready


Having a clean yard helps get your home READY for a wildland fire. Color the leaves that Alex is helping rake.






Mission 4: Get Set

To get SET in case of a wildland fire, Sam and Jordan are packing safety kits with their parent/guardian. What would you put in your safety kit?






Mission 5: Gol
