IMPROVING SNOW REMOVAL

- Raise snowplow operator pay to improve capacity, expertise, and reliability for snow removal.
- Add community engagement position to improve snow communications.

PRIORITIZING PUBLIC SAFETY

- **Expand the Mobile Crisis Team**, which responds to residents in crisis, to 24-hour service.
- Fully fund the Anchorage Safety Patrol and shift service from the Anchorage Health Department to the Anchorage Fire Department to align crisis response.
- Increase recruitment and retention in prosecution to bolster public safety system.

ADDRESSING HOMELESSNESS

- Enhance and support camp cleanup with a 10% increase to the Healthy Spaces budget.
- Fund winter shelter plan aligned with the Mayor's homelessness strategy.
- **Provide year-round shelter** at 56th Avenue location by matching state funds.
- **Fund housing** so that fewer people are sleeping on Anchorage's streets and trails in spring.

GUARANTEEING GOOD GOVERNMENT

- Make municipal jobs more competitive by adjusting wages for non-reps and executives.
- **Kickstart a new grants team** focused on securing large federal and state investments, including infrastructure dollars.

- **November 6, 2024:** Second public hearing on the budget.
- **November 8, 2024:** Budget work session, where Assembly members advanced amendments to proposed budget.
- November 14, 2024: Mayor LaFrance submitted an S version of the 2025 proposed budget submitted to the Assembly.
- November 19, 2024: Budget approved at Anchorage Assembly meeting.
