#### 1. CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL

# 3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

ASSEMBLY MEMBER VOLLAND <u>moved to approve the agenda</u>. ASSEMBLY MEMBER LITTLEFIELD seconded.

MR. JONGENELEN presented STIP Amendment #1. He added that AMATS' staff was just notified on July 4 of the release, providing them with only a few days to review and provide comments. This did not allow enough time for the Technical Advisory Committee to review and provide comments prior to coming before this committee.

The committee discussed projects needing to be listed in the TIP prior to being added into the STIP, public involvement, air quality conformity, fiscal constraint, and Advanced Construct and Advanced Construct Conversions.

JAMES STARZEC assisted with responding to questions.

There were no public comments.

ASSEMBLY MEMBER VOLLAND moved to have AMATS forward the letter with the edits incorporated on to the commissioner. ASSEMBLY MEMBER LITTLEFIELD seconded.

Hearing no objections, the motion passed.

# 7. COMMITTEE COMMENTS

ASSEMBLY MEMBER VOLLAND felt that part of the important function and role of an MPO is to make sure there is a measure of local control when it comes to transportation decisions, infrastructure, and land use. He does not want to amend the TIP in a way just to make the state's priorities go at the potential expense of deprioritizing local priorities, but to make sure the TIP is the leading document.

CHAIR HOLLAND noted that TIP Amendment #2 pulled out all the projects that were on the NHS. There are a lot of important projects not only for the Anchorage community but also the Statewide Transportation System. The list does show some help for the Eagle River residents, which he felt were a little bit misrepresented by AMATS.

# 8. PUBLIC COMMENTS

MR. JONGENELEN noted that AMATS is down to two staff members and has a GIS position in addition to the three current planning vacancies.
