Sometime this week, the 75 millionth passenger will step aboard a People Mover bus, according to Anchorage's Public Transportation Department

The city's bus service, which began in July 1974, is a cause for celebration, and so the People Mover will be free for all riders on all routes Thursday, the agency

People Mover ridership has increased over the past year, especially during January and February of this year when about 660,000 trips were taken during the department's Care About Air free-ride cannaign

The buses' impact on the community is enormous, trans portation director Bob Kniefel said. The buses are particularly important to residents without vehicles who depend on them to get to their jobs, places for shopning and medical visits. Kniefel

April 3 ballot.
The bond, which would cost property taxpayers \$2.18 for each
