Trams are a form of Light Rail Transit

Multi-Vehicle Urban Trains that run on Rail and Electricity

Trams are capable of operating efficiently in cold climates


Trams aid visitors and tourists


Dissuades drunk driving by people going to bars via public transit



The Long and the Short of It

- > 318,000 Anchorage Vehicles registered in DMV (2022) [26]
- Pop. of MOA 287,000 (2022)

- Anchorage will grow
- The City suffers sprawl, congestion, a lack of housing, the high cost of living, and pollution

- Anchorage needs alternatives to the current transportation
- City Issues won't be solved continuing the current status quo
- Over-reliance on automobiles is unsustainable [27]

- Trams offer a physical infrastructure solution
